SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today we celebrate the Christ's gift of the **Eucharist**, the source and summit of our life together as the Church.

This Sunday's Gospel is Mark's account of the Last Supper. At the Passover meal marking the First Covenant, Jesus, the Lamb of the New Covenant, institutes the New Passover of the Eucharist.

Jesus refers to his body being "given up" and his blood being "poured out" for his disciples. We are invited to enter into these very actions of Jesus: to **give up** and to **pour out** our love and compassion for others; all in imitation of Jesus' words and actions at the last supper.

What an incredible challenge that is. We do the "**giving**" and the "**pouring**" of ourselves primarily in response to God's gift in the person of Jesus who accomplishes these actions by his death and resurrection. As we are nourished by Our Lord's actions of giving himself over for the salvation of all, we are challenged to respond similarly to others: that we be nourishment for them as Jesus nourishes us with his life, death and resurrection.

"See you all in the Eucharist!"

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Boniface

c. 675-754 ~ Feast day June 5th

Boniface, the apostle of Germany, started out as an English monk, a popular teacher, preacher and writer who was ordained at 30. He compiled a Latin grammar and wrote many biblical instructions. But he felt called to missionary work, and in 716 landed in Friesland, now in the Netherlands. After a brief stay, he traveled to Rome, where he received a broad commission to evangelize central Germany. By 722, he had become bishop of Germany, where he organized the church and secured its ties to Rome. Later, as archbishop of Mainz and papal legate, he was asked to reform the Frankish church. The patron saint of Germany was martyred in Friesland, the

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, JUNE 10, 2018

Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Genesis 3:9-15

This first reading passage is the account of the Fall of the man and the woman from the Original Grace to the Original Sin in the Garden of Eden after being tempted by the serpent to act against what God had commanded them. The recounts both the entry into trap of the serpent and the consequences that God tell the man and the woman.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 130:1-8

Psalm 130 is both a cry of an individual in the depths of sin and death, and also the cry of God's people for restoration. The psalm shifts from desperation to hope. "With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption."

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

In this passage Paul continues to defend his own ministry for there had been false accusations against him by some false apostle who came to Corinth. His defense is that unlike these false apostles, he relies only on faith in God who raised Jesus Christ to life. He believes and hope that God will raise both himself and his converts in Corinth.

Gospel: Mark 3:20-35

The passage contains two separate stories. First we have the relatives of Jesus who misunderstand why he keeps himself so busy that he cannot even find time to rest or eat. Second we have the scribes who also think that he is possessed by Beelzebub. Jesus first responds to the scribes who charge that He casts out demons by the power of the devil. Jesus responds with a short rhetorical parable. How can Satan drive out Satan? A house divided cannot stand. Jesus shoot their argument in saying that if Satan is fighting Satan that is the end of him. Their charge is in fact the unforgivable sin of blasphemy against the Holy Spirit by calling God an unclean spirit. Jesus takes the opportunity of family being present to speak about the true kinship relationship. "Whoever does the will of his God is my brother and sister and mother."
