PASTOR'S MESSAGE

WHAT DEFINES A MINISTRY AS A CHURCH MINISTRY?

"Ministry" is from the Greek word diakoneo, meaning "to serve" or douleuo, meaning "to serve as a slave." In the New Testament, ministry is seen as service to God and to other people in His name. Jesus provided the pattern for Christian ministry—He came, not to receive service, but to give it (see Matthew 20:28; Mark 10:45; John 13:1-17).

The Christian should minister by meeting people's needs with love and humility on Christ's behalf (see Matthew 20:26; Mark 10:43; John 2:5,9; Acts 6:3; Romans 1:1; Galatians 1:10; Colossians 4:12). Christians are to minister to others out of their devotion to Christ and their love for others, whether the other people are believers or unbelievers. Ministry to others should be impartial and unconditional, always seeking to help others as Jesus would.

In Catholic usage the various forms of ministry include these features: 1) service of God, who is glorified by the loving service given to others; 2) authorization by the Church's hierarchy, whether the Pope directly or the local ordinary; this authorization may require ordination, as in the priestly ministry, or consecration, as in the priestly ministry, or consecration, as in religious life; or liturgical blessing, as with lectors and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion; 3) based on the teaching of Christ, who showed by word and example how to minister to people's spiritual and temporal needs; and 4) under the guidance of the Church in accordance with her directives and decrees.

The content of ministry seems to prioritize the ministering in spiritual things, not just practical things. Ministry should certainly place emphasis on sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with others so they can come to know Him and receive Him as personal Savior, go on to experience Him as Lord of their life, and go even further to know Christ as the essence of their Life (see John 1:12; Colossians 2:6-7; Galatians 2:20; Philippians 3:8-10). Ministry can, and should, include ministering to the physical, emotional, educational, mental, vocational, and financial needs of others. Jesus did, and so should we!

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION (JOHN 16:12 - 15)

On this Most Holy Trinity Sunday, let us reflect on a mystery that ultimately is beyond our comprehension. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity—one God in three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Sometimes, when we talk about the Trinity, we get all caught up in our “heads,” struggling to come up with all kinds of elaborate and complicated descriptions and explanations. If I had to say only one thing about the Trinity, one core idea about this mystery, that might be helpful to us this day as we strive to live lives of faith, it is this: God --- Father, Son, and Spirit --- is essentially a communion of love. The very essence of God is love, and therefore no other word can say as much about him. Love is at the very heart of who he is, a love which is not contained or confined within the divine relationships, but rather is poured out --- generously, continuously, relentlessly upon all of creation --- fashioned in God’s very image and likeness.

To say that we believe in God, that we believe in Father, Son, and Spirit, means that we believe in love --- that we believe in the necessity of it, the divine nature of it, that we believe in its ability to transform the world. The supreme evidence of a faithful life is not the things we say or the prayers we pray, but the love we share. There is no other measure that carries more weight or says more about the depth of our commitment and love for God --- Father, Son, and Spirit. It starts and ends with love.

God loves us so much . . . and is willing to do whatever it takes to make it the beautiful place he created it to be and died for it to be. He looks at you and me and sees his children. He looks at broken relationships and sees them healed and strong. He looks at troubled youth and sees them starting down the right path. He looks at the animosity between peoples, countries, and religions and sees real understanding and compassion. He looks at death in all its forms and sees life. And what does he do in every single case, in every single situation, to every single person . . . he loves. It is as simple as that. After all, that’s who God is --- Father, Son, and Spirit.

CORPUS CHRISTI FAMILY NOVENA



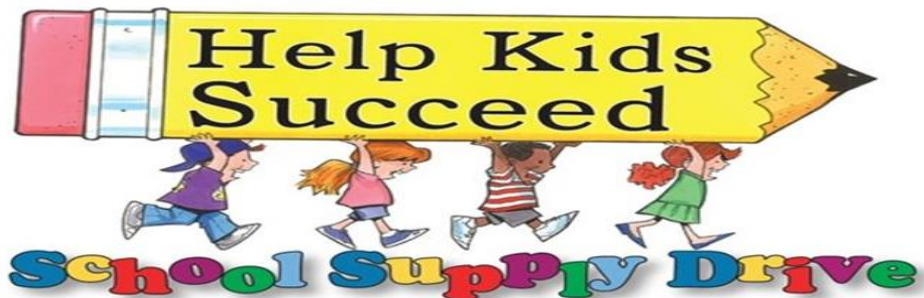

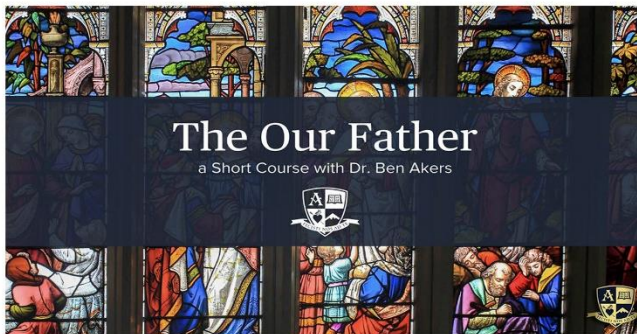

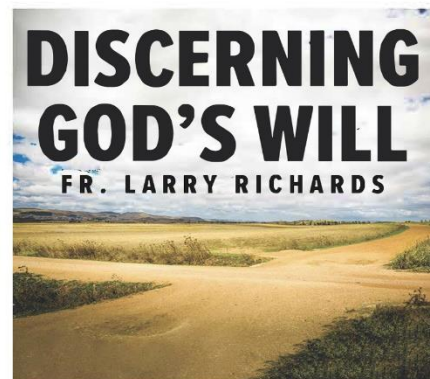
