PASTOR'S CORNER

The Procession

Mass always begins with a procession. Depending on the situation, the procession can be long and ornate with a cast of dozens, or very short sometimes just the priest himself. Often at the head of the procession is a crucifer, an altar server carrying a cross or crucifix.

While it may seem that the procession is just pomp and circumstance, it is actually rich in meaning and symbolism. First, the cross symbolizes Jesus, and helps us to “[keep] our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith” according to Hebrews 12:2. The candles in the procession symbolize the light of Christ, which we are all supposed to bring to the world. And the procession itself symbolizes the Church, the people of God, a pilgrim people making their way toward heaven. Remember, the Mass is the heavenly banquet, the wedding feast of the Lamb!

Finally, the procession may conjure up images of Jesus’ triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. Just as then, we, the people, welcome Jesus into our midst as He offers His Body and Blood for us.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION (LUKE 12: 49-53)

***Do you think that I have come to
establish peace on the earth?
No, I tell you, but rather division."***

What exactly is Jesus talking about? Often, the image we have of Jesus is one of peace, love, and forgiveness. In this Gospel passage, Jesus is painting a much different picture of how things are going to be.

It is important to realize that Jesus uses many different means by which he calls people to holiness and by which he instructs his followers in the ways of God. Sometimes he chooses to tell them an edifying story or parable. But occasionally he says the tough things to his disciples probably in the hope that they understand what he is saying.



If we simply focus on the "division" aspect of this passage, we might miss out on what might be the main theme of Jesus' message'. Early in this passage, he tells his disciples something that can help shed light on what Jesus' mission is all about. He tells them,

"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!"

When we think of fire, many of us see it as a tragedy, as a destructive force that leaves virtually nothing in its path. The fire Jesus is most likely talking about is not something that will destroy the earth --- but rather is something that will transform it. It is like the fire within each human heart, a fire which is fueled by the living God within--a fire which continually creates a new every person who is open to it.

Jeremiah learned that first-hand, as we heard in the First Reading. His "reward" for accepting the call of God and for "telling the truth", was to be thrown into a cistern to die. And in the Second Reading the author of the Letter to the Hebrews makes clear that if Jesus faced so much opposition and suffering for carrying out his Father's will, we should expect something similar --- a sharing in that same struggle.

That is the challenge of discipleship. And yet, if we think about what is possible when we open ourselves up to the transforming fire of God, we most certainly will come to realize that it far outweighs whatever the cost. May each of us be the fuel God uses to make the world the beautiful place he created it to be. And may we never fear the fire of God, but welcome it with open hearts.

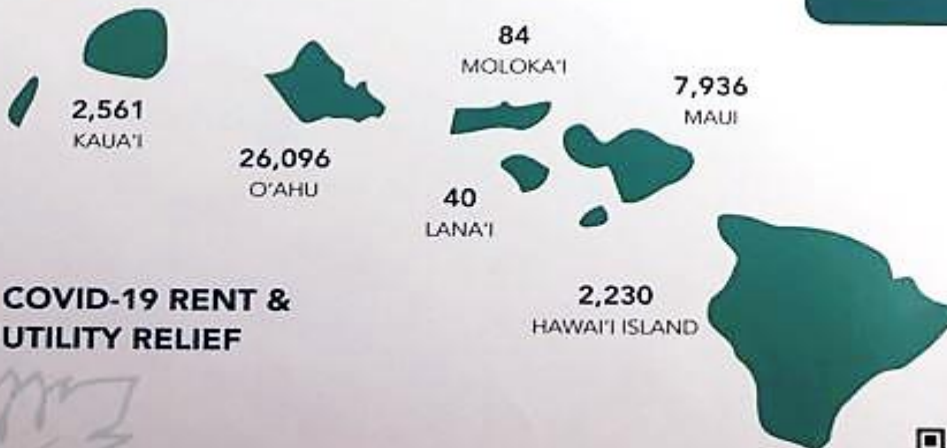

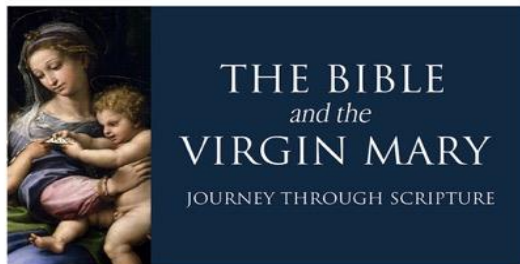
WATCH THE WOMAN

THE BIBLE AND THE VIRGIN MARY: EPISODE 11: THE ASSUMPTION

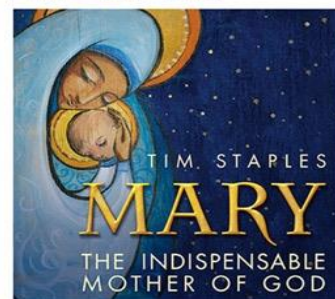
