PASTOR'S CORNER

Aloha my brothers and sisters:

This week I would like to talk about what Catholic prayer of thanksgiving or gratitude is.

It is a way of expressing thankfulness to God for all blessings received, both spiritual and physical. It can be a simple prayer of gratitude, or a more formal prayer found in the Catholic Liturgy. Some common themes include acknowledging God's goodness, expressing gratitude for blessings, and asking for continued graces.

Key elements of a prayer of thanksgiving and gratitude:

- Acknowledge God's presence: Expressing gratitude to a higher power.
- Express gratitude for blessings: Recognizing and appreciating both tangible and intangible gifts.
- Offer praise: Uplifting praise for God's goodness and faithfulness.
- Include specific details: Mentioning specific people, situations, or events that you are grateful for:
- Pray for others: Including those who are struggling or in need.
- End with a respectful closing: Such as "Amen" or "In Jesus' name".
- Gratefully yours in the heart of Jesus Christ.

Therefore, as disciples of Christ we must all remember our discipleship life and gratitude towards God's are closely intertwined. Jesus emphasized the importance of thanking God for blessings, including food. He modeled a life of gratitude in his actions and teachings, even in the face of hardship. Discipleship is about learning to live a life of gratitude, recognizing all blessings as coming from God, and expressing thankfulness in all circumstances.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION BY CATHOLIC STEWARDSHIP CONSULTANTS

Throughout the Easter season, our readings have given us glimpses into the life of the newborn Church and the bold witness of the early disciples in spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ to all who would listen.

The disciples were the first to live a stewardship way of life, and their example is as relevant today as it was 2,000 years ago.

In the First Reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, we catch up with Paul and Barnabas in Antioch.



While they certainly have some success in reaching many people there with the message of salvation, others are downright infuriated by their words and send them packing. Yet, we read that “the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.” Overall, it seems as if Paul and Barnabas had failed in Antioch. But seeing failure has not robbed them of their joy. What’s more, they are filled to the brim with the abundant gifts of the Holy Spirit. How is this possible? It is only possible because Paul and Barnabas saw themselves as nothing more and nothing less than stewards of Christ and His Good News. This realization brought them freedom — to offer themselves and their lives to others for the sake of the Gospel. The “results” of their efforts were up to God.

This Spirit-filled, joy-filled life is available to us all today. It can be achieved when we recognize, as did Paul and Barnabas, that all we have and all we are is a gift from God, meant to be shared with others for His glory. Of course, living as God’s stewards does not guarantee a life of ease or a life free of sacrifice. Sometimes the steward’s life involves challenges, requiring all the strength and love one has to give. In the end, there is simply no more satisfying way to live.

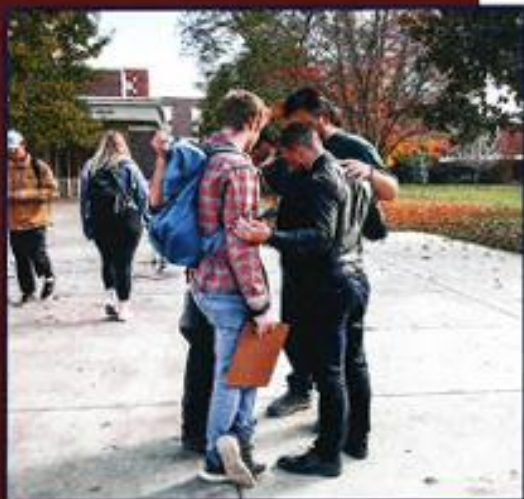

NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT

THRIVING CAMPUS MINISTRIES SPARK NEW VOCATIONS

"It's standing-room only at Sunday evening Mass," says Fr. Tim Holeda, pastor of the campus parish at Florida State University, where 700 students fill the pews and more than 100 spill into the aisles. "I had to add an extra student Mass," he says happily. "Our student ministry is rockin'... we have hundreds in Bible studies, hundreds at retreats. It's been amazing for a long time, but now it's exploding. God is good!"

Fr. Holeda also happens to be the Vocation Director of the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee, and the boom at FSU is leading to a bumper crop of seminarians. The small diocese will ordain four priests this year and expects to accept at least five men for seminary studies.

FSU is just one example of thriving campus ministries that have led to increased vocations. One of the best examples is the Diocese of Austin, whose four major universities each has its own dynamic campus ministry. The diocese accepted 24 men to seminary last fall.

Part of the upward trend is the effectiveness of FOCUS missionaries who follow the principle of "spiritual multiplication" by starting small Bible studies on campus whose participants go on to start their own groups. FOCUS reports that more than 1,000 alumni have entered seminary or religious formation.

One big takeaway: as Catholic parents guide their children in choosing a college, it's wise to place high importance on the health of its campus ministry!

A PRIEST IN TIMES SQUARE

Did you know there's an enormous statue of a Catholic priest in Times Square? Fr. Francis Duffy was a teacher in New York City who was ordained a priest in 1896. He served in the Spanish-American War as chaplain of the legendary Fighting 69th Infantry, and later in World War I. Hundreds of soldiers testified to his incredible compassion and bravery as he accompanied the wounded in the thick of battle. Fr. Duffy remains the most decorated cleric in U.S. Army history.



Future Pope?

Listen to enough vocation stories, and several patterns emerge.

There's the convert-to-priest, the devout guy who went straight to college seminary, the men who felt called later in life, and surprisingly common, those who wanted to be priests ever since they were little kids.

When parents openly discuss priesthood and religious life as joyful, fulfilling vocations—not just rare exceptions—it plants seeds that may one day bear fruit. A child who grows up knowing that marriage, priesthood, or religious life are all viable paths is more likely to discern with freedom when the time comes.

So parents take note: our future priests and sisters are already in cry rooms, climbing on pews, and sneaking extra donuts after Mass!

HEROIC PRIESTS

NEEDED: FAITH AND VALOR



"Soldiers and military families simply don't have enough priests," says Fr. Peter Poinposello, an Army priest chaplain. The Archdiocese of the Military Services is the largest diocese in the U.S., but has only about 200 priests, which includes chaplains stationed at far-flung bases overseas.

Fr. Pete, who is popular on Instagram as @fr.unclesam, feels that we need to start younger. "We need to get young boys dreaming of a life of heroic service," he said. "Many want to grow up to be soldiers. Some want to be priests. I say to them: 'Why not both?'"

His starting place is to tell the stories of real-life heroes. "You don't have to make this stuff up," he said. "Our history is full of priest-chaplains who gave their lives for God and country. I can't think of anything more inspiring for young men today."

INTENTIONAL PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

"Realistically, what can I actually do to promote vocations?" This was a question Fr. Greg Gerhart heard repeatedly. As any good Vocation Director would do, he asked people to pray. "But I sensed that a lot of people wanted more direction, something more concrete," he said. In the wake of his very popular *Discernment 180* books, Fr. Greg has written *Pray180*, which helps people supercharge their prayer for vocations, while also improving their own spiritual lives. The new book helps them create a rule of life, commit to various spiritual practices, and read a daily reflection for six months (180 days). "The idea is to be intentional—not just to offer an occasional prayer, but to grow in holiness while interceding daily for vocations."
