Pastor's Corner

Aloha my brothers and sisters,

This past weekend May 3, 2026, we started praying the Prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This marks the start of a month-long preparation period for us as a parish to prepare ourselves, our hearts and our parish for the Enthroning of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in our parish.

Enthroning the Sacred Heart of Jesus in a parish acts as a powerful spiritual protection by officially recognizing Jesus as King and Master over families and the community. This act brings profound blessings, including fostering deep Eucharistic love, renewing parish vocations, sanctifying homes against modern secularism, and providing a "rampart" of peace and strength for parishioners during trials. We will be holding this Enthronement Ceremony on Sunday June 14, 2026, during our 9:00 AM Mass.

Key Benefits of Parish Enthronement:

- **Protection Against Evil:** The act acts as a "rampant against the seductive influences and teachings of the modern corrupted world," protecting families and the parish from spiritual dangers.
- **Establishment of Divine Authority:** It is an act of justice that honors Jesus as the rightful King and Lord of the parish, bringing his reign into the community.
- **Sanctification of Families:** It transforms homes into "domestic sanctuaries of charity and unity," creating a strong Catholic atmosphere and reversing the effects of a "godless, perverted world,".
- **Increased Spiritual Fervor:** It encourages "frequent and devout attendance at Mass and reception of Holy Communion," which strengthens the overall spiritual life of the parish.
- **Support for the Pastor:** The enthronement bridges the gap between home and church, creating a "close relationship between priests and families". It helps "tepid souls" become fervent.
- **Blessings and Peace:** Jesus promised to bless each home where a picture of the Sacred Heart is exposed and honored.

Sixth Sunday of Easter – Year A

Acts 8:5–8, 14–17 – They laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

1 Peter 3:15–18 – In the flesh he was put to death, but in the spirit, he was brought to life.

John 14:15–21 – I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate.

Peter today gives us a wonderful description of the evangelist—and each of us is called to be one. We begin by keeping Christ in our hearts and honoring Him there. Evangelization is founded upon our personal and communal ongoing conversion. If that constant conversion ceases, our message dries up and becomes empty. We cannot truly share Christ if He is not first in our hearts.

Then, we must always be ready to explain to anyone who asks the reason for our hope. Why do we continue to live in hope when it may seem easier—or even more reasonable—to fall into despair, considering what is happening in the world? What is the reason for your hope? How does Jesus give you hope? And are you willing to explain it when asked?

Peter also teaches us how we are to share this hope. First, with gentleness. We have all encountered people who try to force their beliefs or opinions on others. This is not how we are called to share the Gospel. When someone asks us about our faith, we respond with gentleness. We share only as much as they are open to receiving. We remain attentive to how they hear our message and place their needs before our own desire to speak.

And we share with reverence. Our reverence is first for Christ, who is our Lord and the source of our joy. But our reverence is also for the person before us. They, too, are loved by Christ, and the Holy Spirit is at work within them. We are simply helping them to recognize this Spirit who gives them life and to come to know and name Jesus, as we have.

Pope Leo XIV Appoints Fr. Michael T. Castori as Bishop-Elect of Honolulu

With gratitude and hope, we give thanks for the faithful leadership of Bishop Larry Silva, who has lovingly shepherded the Church in Hawai'i since 2005, and we joyfully welcome Fr. Michael T. Castori as the newly appointed Bishop-Elect of Honolulu.

Appointed by Pope Leo XIV, Bishop-Elect Castori brings a heart for service, pastoral care, and Jesuit spirituality as he begins this new chapter with the people of Hawai'i. Please join us in praying for both Bishop Larry Silva and Bishop-Elect Fr. Michael T. Castori as they continue their mission of faith, hope, and love.

Father Castori is a member of the Society of Jesus, also known as the Jesuits. He entered the New York Province of the Society of Jesus in 1987, later transferring to the Jesuits' USA West Province, and was ordained to the priesthood on June 13, 1998. Father Castori comes to the Diocese of Honolulu from the Arrupe Jesuit Community at Seattle University, where he had served as rector. Prior to his time in Washington, he served in numerous roles in the Diocese of Oakland, Calif., and held pastoral and teaching roles across California.

Father Castori is an expert in Biblical studies. He holds a Ph.D. in Near Eastern religions (late ancient Biblical interpretations) from the University of California, Berkeley, earned in 2008, and has edited or written several works on the Bible.

Father Castori was born Oct. 21, 1960, and grew up in Carmichael, Calif. He is the son of Michael and Lucille Castori (now deceased) and has two older sisters, JoAnn and Pamela. His parents and siblings were all teachers.

Father Castori attended Jesuit High School in Sacramento, graduating in 1978. He earned a bachelor's degree in classics from Harvard University in Cambridge, Mass., in 1982, and a master's degree in philosophical resources from Fordham University in the Bronx, N.Y., in 1991.

He has a Master of Divinity degree from the Jesuit School of Theology at Berkeley, earned in 1998, and obtained a licentiate in sacred theology (Biblical theology) there in 2009. He also attended the Hebrew University of Jerusalem with a focus on Hebrew language studies in 1999.



Next steps for the Diocese of Honolulu

To formally become Bishop of Honolulu, Father Castori first will be ordained a bishop (an "episcopal ordination"), then installed in his new seat in the Diocese of Honolulu.

His episcopal ordination and installation will take place Tuesday, July 28, at 10 a.m. at the Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa, 712 N. School Street, Honolulu.

Beginning May 6, Bishop Larry Silva will serve as the diocese's apostolic administrator; he is still "in charge" until Father Castori is officially installed as bishop, though he will discuss any major decisions that might affect the future of the diocese with Father Castori.

After July 28, Bishop Silva's title will become the Bishop Emeritus of Honolulu, while Father Castori will become Bishop Castori, the Bishop of Honolulu.

Parish Restrooms Reopened Following Major Emergency Repairs

Aloha, my brothers and sisters,

The wait is over — our Men's and Women's Restrooms are officially back in service and fully repaired. Mahalo for your patience and understanding as we worked through this unexpected situation.

We would like to provide an update regarding the emergency repairs undertaken by the parish to address the damages caused by a major water leak.

On Monday, April 13, 2026, a 2-inch water pipe located above and between the Men's and Women's Restrooms burst, resulting in a significant water leak. This caused extensive damage to the drywall ceilings and walls of both restrooms, as well as the hallway ceiling leading to the Women's Restroom.

Under the guidance of the Diocese, the following actions were taken to address the issue:

- Damage and leak inspection
- Demolition
- Plumbing repairs and drywall installation
- Drywall finishing
- Final sanding and painting
- Emergency labor services

As part of the repairs, we replaced the damaged drywall with water-resistant drywall, commonly known as "green board," which is specially designed to resist moisture in high-humidity areas such as bathrooms, kitchens, and basements.

The total cost of the emergency repairs amounted to \$136,960.68. The parish utilized the following funds to cover these expenses:

- PSRF Building Fund – \$41,000
- PSRF Savings – \$28,000
- BOH Building Account – \$28,000
- Anonymous Parishioner Donation – \$20,000
- Remaining Balance Covered by BOH Checking – \$19,960.68

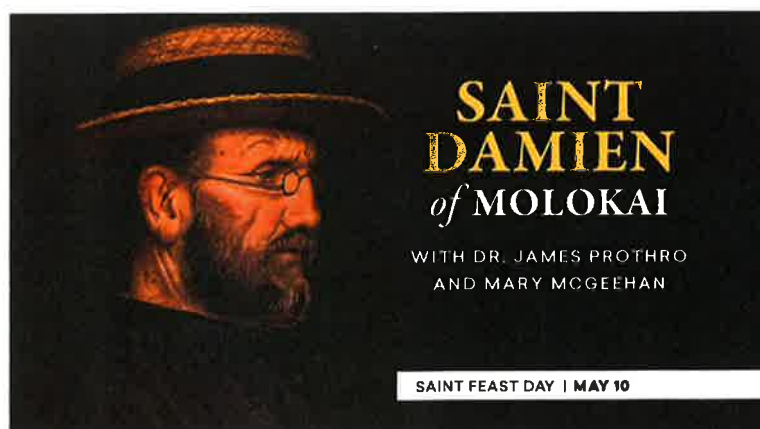
We are deeply grateful to the generous parishioner who donated toward these repairs and wish to remain anonymous.

The parish also has plans to replenish our savings through several fundraising activities already scheduled for the coming year to strengthen our PSRF repair and maintenance account. This is in addition to our monthly maintenance collection, which averages a little over \$2,000 per month.

Thank you once again for your prayers, patience, and continued support of our parish community.
