Pastor's Corner

Last week, we looked at what an active parishioner in a missionary-style Catholic parish looks like. This week, we will look at what an active ministry is in a missionary style parish. In a Catholic missionary parish, ministry shifts from inward-focused maintenance to outward-focused evangelization. Rather than simply running administrative programs, active ministry operates as a daily, relationally driven way of life. The focus centers on making disciples, building deep personal connections, and actively seeking out the unchurched.

A vibrant, missionary-style parish relies on several defining characteristics:

1. Small Relational Groups

- **Discipleship over Education:** Small groups exist to transform lives rather than just convey information. These gatherings focus on mutual accountability, deep friendships, and equipping members to disciple others.
- **Neighborhood Focus:** Ministry happens outside church walls. Parishioners and missionaries engage in the community where people work, study, and live, establishing trust before sharing the Gospel.

2. The Kerygma as the Centerpiece

- **Proclamation-style Outreach:** Retreats, homilies, and outreach events are designed to clearly proclaim the Kerygma—the foundational message of Jesus's life, death, resurrection, and the offer of salvation.
- **Spiritual Multiplication:** Ministries focus on identifying, forming, and empowering leaders who can multiply the mission rather than depending solely on clergy or paid staff.

3. Culture of Encounter and Hospitality

- **Welcoming Environment:** Sunday Masses and events feature radical hospitality. The focus is on following up with visitors, praying for them, and helping them transition from strangers to active members of the community.
- **Sacramental Encounters:** Liturgies and sacraments (like Confession and the Eucharist) are celebrated as profound spiritual encounters. They are viewed as the "source and summit" that continuously sends the community back out on mission.

4. Servanthood and the Works of Mercy

- **Meeting Physical & Spiritual Needs:** The active ministry addresses both the bodily and spiritual needs of the local community. This includes visiting the sick, prison ministry, feeding the hungry, and providing emotional support.
- **Lifestyle Integration:** Parishioners view their everyday lives as a mission field. Ministry is not an isolated volunteer task for a few hours a week; it is an integrated lifestyle.

†REST IN PEACE†

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A

Exodus 19:2-6 You will be a kingdom of priests, a consecrated nation.

Romans 5:6-11 We have been reconciled to God through the death of his Son; we are saved by his life.

Matthew 9:36-20:8 He summoned his twelve disciples and sent them out.

Paul meditates upon God's great love for us. While we were still sinners, God reached out in love to us: Christ died for us. How unthinkable this is! As Paul says, you are not likely to die for a good person let alone for someone who is unworthy. Yet this is just what God has done. We are still, every one of us, reconciled in Christ. Now this is the real good news. Everyone is already reconciled in Christ. It does not depend upon becoming worthy of it; it does not depend upon straightening out our lives. It comes as a totally free gift from God.

Shouldn't everybody have the chance to hear this good news? This is exactly our ministry as evangelizers. We are here to deliver this gospel to people in whatever way possible, in the hope that they can hear it and come to rejoice with us in God through our Lord Jesus Christ. We proclaim the gospel through our words, through our actions, through our values, through our very lives.

Pope's June prayer intention: 'for the values of sports'

School of fraternity, peace, and encounter

He thanks the Lord for "the gift of sport, for those who glorify God through the exercise of their bodies, for the friendships born on the field, and the joy of playing as a team."

As Pope Leo recalls how the Lord teaches us "that in life, as in the game, no one is saved alone," the Holy Father insists we "need others to grow, to learn respect, to overcome our limits, and to celebrate together the victories we achieve."

Thus, Pope Leo prays that sport "may always be a school of fraternity, not of empty rivalry, a space of encounter, not exclusion, a path of peace, not violence."

Uniting people and growing closer to Christ

"May those who play, train or cheer," the Pope said, "discover in sport a universal language that brings cultures together, unites peoples, and sows respect, solidarity, and personal growth."

He also prays that every sport "become a parable of life lived with you, working with joy and effort, living with humility in defeat and with gratitude in the victory you offer in your Resurrection."

"May your Spirit," the Holy Father concluded, "never be lacking in us, making us one team, united with you to build communion and fraternity in history."

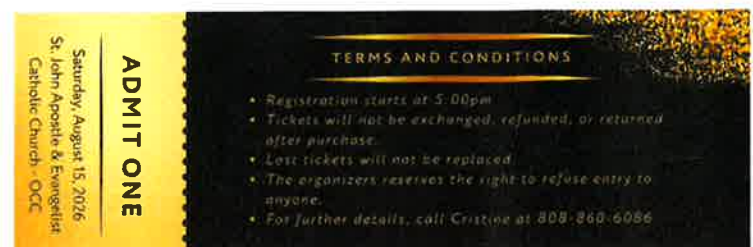
This will be followed by a catered reception dinner, where we will share the history of our parish and its accomplishments with one another and with the greater Mililani community, whom we are also inviting to this event.
