SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today is *Good Shepherd Sunday* where we are invited to look at Jesus as that honorable shepherd who watches over and cares for his sheep.

Jesus identifies with both the Good Shepherd and the gate in today's gospel. As good shepherd, he watches over us constantly. He keeps us nourished and safe from what may harm us and he is the gate we pass through while he continues to care for us at each moment.

This is what he is sent to do by the heavenly Father. Jesus is meant to be the very embodiment of God's loving care for each and all of us. Yes, we are sheep and the message here is to continue to watch for and receive God's merciful love, goodness and care. God is constantly on our side; the Good Shepherd is never on vacation, but always there for you and me just as the shepherd in today's gospel is there pouring himself out for his sheep.

As God's beloved we inherit the gracious goodness we are offered. Let us be vigilant to discover it and to be impelled to pass it on to others who call out to us to share that abundant mercy and forgiveness as the shepherd spent his love and care for those entrusted to him.

This fourth Sunday of Easter is also a Day of Prayer for Vocations. Saint of the WEEK Pope John I (d. 526)



Feast Day: May 18 - When he was elected pope in 523, this Tuscan was a senior deacon in Rome. He quickly became embroiled in an Arian heresy conflict between the Byzantine Emperor, Justin I, and the Arian King Theodoric, who ruled in present-day Italy.

By decree, Emperor Justin seized Arian churches in Constantinople in 524. King Theodoric in turn ordered the pope and others to go to

Constantinople to stop Emperor Justin. Upon the pope's entreaty, Justin agreed to only some of the Theodoric's demands, rather than completely withdrawing his decree against the Arians.

When the pope returned to Italy, King Theodoric imprisoned him at Ravenna for his failure to secure all his requests from the emperor. Weary and ill from the voyage, the pope died in prison; he was immediately honored as a martyr.

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, MAY 14, 2017

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 6:1-7

The first reading describes briefly the problem the apostolic Christian community had to face in order to maintain its unity. The reading shows developing tensions and jealousies between Christians of Jewish and of Greek origins. This passage also shows a developing diversity of ministry: ministry of the table (the Diaconate) and ministry of the word (the Priestly ministry).



Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 33:1-2, 4-5, 18-19

Psalm 33 speaks of the Lord as being faithful in the past, and so he will continue to be faithful. The Lord recognizes his own, those who hope in him, and will preserve and deliver them from all danger. Response: "Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you."

Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:4-9

The passage recalls Psalm 118 and refers to Jesus as the stone rejected by the builders and who has become the cornerstone, the capstone, of the structure. Peter also describes the people of the new covenant as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people God claims for his very own."

Gospel: John 14:1-12

The Gospel reading is part of John's account of Jesus' farewell teaching at the last supper. Here Jesus speaks about his continued presence with his disciples. Reference to the many dwelling places of the Father's house emphasizes his desire to be with us; to help us to find our way to him, for to know him is to know the way. Thus, we can come to the Father only by following his way. Jesus is also the truth and the life. Therefore, to know him is to know the Father. To have life in him is to have life in the Father. To see Jesus is to see the Father, for the Father and Jesus are one.
