SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

You will recall that in the Gospel of last Sunday Jesus used the image of the "Gate" of the sheepfold to refer to himself. In the Gospel of this Sunday the Risen Lord calls himself the "Way". In the light of the resurrection, the risen Lord is not only the Gate but also the Way to where He is going and where He wants us to follow. Thomas, being realistic, asks Jesus, "Lord we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?" Thomas is thinking of the way in physical terms. He imagines that if Jesus could only give them a simple road map and directions to where he is going, they would surely get there. Jesus surprises them in saying, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me". In other words, do not ask for directions for Jesus the Way to the Father. Just let go and follow Jesus Christ. Do not speculate for he is the Truth. If you want to live, go to Jesus and remain in him who is the life itself.

The Gospel therefore helps us to become more deeply aware that to find Christ is to find the Way, Truth and the Life. To try to seek the way, the truth and the life elsewhere is to get lost and die on the way. Christ identifies himself with the way, the truth and the life. In other words, to follow the risen Lord is to find the fullness of life in the triune God. If we take another direction we will certainly be lost and die on the way. What the risen Lord is offering us is Life itself and the fullness of the Truth, in terms of the hereafter. Christ also tells his disciples that to find him is to find the Father, because we can only reach the Father through Christ, because the Son is in the Father and the Father is in the Son. It is because of Christ's intimate union with the Father in the power of the Holy Spirit, that he is able to do the things that he does. Our union with the Father through Christ will also enable us to "perform the same works" Christ does.

FACT OF FAITH

WHAT DOES THE CHURCH BELIEVE ABOUT MARY?

Traditionally the Catholic Church has honored Mary, the mother of Jesus, during the month of May. Some parishes hold May processions— participants sing hymns about Mary, recite the Rosary, and crown a statue of Mary with a wreath of flowers. Some people believe, mistakenly, that Catholics worship Mary. Worship is reserved to God alone. From the earliest times, however, Christians have sought Mary's prayers and help. They ask Mary to intercede on their behalf, which is entirely appropriate given Mary's preeminent role in salvation history. The Church teaches that Mary is the first and the greatest of all the disciples of Christ. Through her "yes" to the angel, she conceived Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit and truly became the Mother of God. As the Mother of God, it was fitting that she was given the great gift of being preserved from Original Sin. This is called the Immaculate Conception. Pope Paul VI gave Mary the title of Mother of the Church. Just as Mary prayed with the Apostles and disciples after Jesus' Death, she continues to pray before God for the Church and all humanity. The Church honors Mary on various days throughout the liturgical year. In many parts of the world there are popular, local devotions to Mary. Mary in her Immaculate Conception is the patroness of the United States. This feast is usually celebrated on December 8.

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, MAY 21, 2017

First Reading: Acts 8:5-8, 14-17

The first reading recounts how the Gospel spread from the first Jerusalem community to the Samaritans who were of Jewish origin but considered "half-Gentile." The preaching of Philip, accompanied by signs, convinced the people, leading them to conversion. The laying of hands by Simon Peter and John, although reflecting something of the origins of confirmation and/or "baptism in the Holy Spirit," was mainly a sign of the acceptance of the Samaritan Christian community by the Jerusalem community, which would of course involve a sharing or recognition of the same Spirit.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 66:1-3, 4-5, 6-7, 16, 20

Psalm 66 commemorates the deliverance of Israel from her enemies, and witnesses with joy to the nations the Lordship of Israel's God. Response: "Let all the earth cry out to God with joy."

Second Reading: 1 Peter 3:15-18

In the second reading, Peter exhorts the new Christian community to be ready to give witness to anyone who asks about the reason for their hope in Christ. That hope in Christ should be evident in their lifestyle. Moreover, Christian gentleness and respect will help them in overcoming even the persecution they may experience in their witness. The example of Christ's own suffering is the model for the follower of Christ, so that they too may be brought to life in the Spirit.

Gospel: John 14:15-21

The Gospel reading is a continuation of Jesus' farewell discourse. Here Jesus speaks about the inseparable link between love and obedience to his commandments as a means by which all followers will know his continuing presence. Thus, Jesus promises his followers that he would ask the Father for another Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who would guarantee his presence to guide them. The return of Jesus in this passage underlines his continued presence within his Church. That presence will be expressed and realized by his faithful disciples in their union with Christ, just as Christ is one with the Father.
