SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

Sincerity and living our faith!

The reading from Genesis shows how Adam and Eve, exercising their free will, have gone against God's intentional will that God's creatures should live in innocence, harmony with creation and peace with each other. Their sin is about being exposed before the Lord. They were revealed as proud; they wanted to be like God. Their desires were more important than God's will. It is sad, but in many occasions we can look into the depths of the 'original sin' and see our own refusal to submit to God's will as well as our own rationalization for the things we do wrong. Because of sin we do hide in fear causing a separation from God and our most intimate loved ones. It becomes difficult to say "I'm sorry." We don't even want God to find us and so avoid quiet moments for prayer. But we need to remember that God wants us to turn to him, stand before him without fear and allow him to transform us and bring something good out of whatever we have botched up.

In the second reading Paul exhorts the Corinthian community and us to remain focused on the things of God and not of the earth, to remember that faith ultimately triumphs over misery, sin and death. We should look at everything we do here as a preparation for our eternal life. We live in hope that by virtue of our faith we will share in Jesus' Resurrection. The God who raised Jesus from the dead will also raise us and bring us into his presence. Finally the Gospel speaks about how Jesus is rejected by the scribes and his family. He has been preaching and healing and he has just selected his twelve disciples. But he is misunderstood; his family, the scribes and even the disciples do not yet recognize that he is truly the Son of God. Jesus' response is to redefine family and restore our original blessing; our connection to his father and each other as children of God. His words are words to us today - he looks around at us and sees us as his brothers and sisters. This will make a difference as to how we see each other

OCC Groundbreaking Event, Saturday, June 16 2018.

That's right! Last Sunday, we have officially announced that we will be celebrating a groundbreaking event on Saturday, June 16, starting with 5pm Vigil Mass, presided by Msgr. Gary Secor, Vicar General of the Diocese of Honolulu.

The Leadership Advisory Council (LAC) has worked hard both on the plans and the financing of the One Community Center to make sure that the facility we want is both cost effective and functional. The 7,000 square foot multi-purpose facility will accommodate 500 people. It will have an office, a warming kitchen, handicap accessible bathrooms, storage and modern audio/visual technology including a 9'x12' screen to livestream Mass and other liturgical functions in the overflow, for example Christmas and Easter. There will be space to move various activities and events currently held in the church but do not belong in our sanctuary, such as concerts, presentations, town hall meetings, parish-wide events, large parish ministry gatherings, etc. The One Community Center will expand our parish community capacity for our parish ministries' meetings and formation events, as well as our ability for outreach in Central and Northern Oahu.

Almost 20 years ago, there was a vision to build a parish hall at the time of the renovation of the present church. Now, God has brought us to another great milestone in our parish to realize that vision with the One Community Center. It has taken a long time to get to this point. These are exciting times for the Catholic Community of St. John Apostle & Evangelist. The groundbreaking ceremony is a clear sign that we are building!

As your pastor, I have great faith that God who has brought us to this stage in our vision, will also lead us to its realization through our stewardship spirit of generosity. Once again I take the opportunity to thank those who have submitted their capital campaign pledge card and continue to honor it. As we begin construction, we will need the continuous flow of funds. Mahalo and may God bless you with more so that you may give back to serve God's needs through the parish.

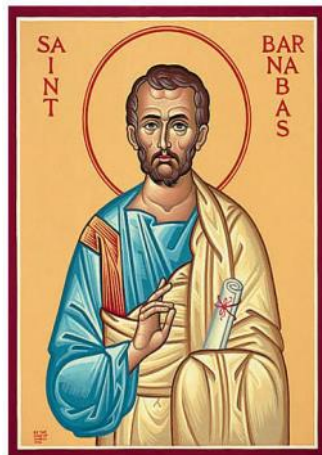

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Barnabas

First Century Feast Day—June 11

The story of this early missionary, a Cypriot Jew called Joseph, is told in the Acts of the Apostles. He was named Barnabas (son of encouragement) by the Twelve Apostles when he sold property and gave them the money (4:36-37). He introduced the convert Paul to the apostles (9:27), was officially sent by the Jerusalem church to Antioch (11:22-26), was set apart with Paul by the Spirit for a mission to Cyprus (13:2), attended the Council of Jerusalem (15:12), and returned to Cyprus with Mark (15:36-41). By tradition, he was martyred there.

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, JUNE 17, 2018**Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time**First Reading: Ez 17:22-24

The Prophet Ezekiel in this passage uses the image (allegory) of the cedar tree to prophesy that the kingdom after the return from exile will be more than just restoration the situation before the exile. It will be a realization of the messianic kingdom. This prophecy finds its fulfillment in the kingdom proclaimed by Christ, and of which the Church on earth is a foretaste.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 92:1-2, 12-15

This psalm of thanksgiving originally used at the morning sacrifice focuses on the theme of moral retribution. The Lord is praised for his mighty deeds, especially in rewarding the righteous with prosperity, so that they become like fruitful trees. However, this theology needs to be balanced with that of other books of Scripture in Psalm 73 as well as the Book of Job that show that the righteous do not always prosper.

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:6-10

In this passage, Paul is still in his defense of his work as an apostle against false apostle. He speaks of his confident hope of the resurrection, and so he can now face the dissolution of the body with confidence, because God will replace it with the resurrected body. That is why he argues that in the present physical body we are absent from the Lord. Yes, we are certainly in Christ as members of his body, are not yet with Christ as the false apostle taught. In this argument, Paul underlines his teaching of "not yet" as against the false teachers who claimed that we are already with Christ.

Gospel: Mark 4:26-34

This Gospel passage consists of two short parables: 1) the seed growing secretly; and 2) the mustard seed. Each parable contains only one main point, which is the basic message. The parable of the seed growing secretly seeks to show the contrast between the insignificant beginnings of Jesus' ministry and the final manifestation of the kingdom already present secretly in his ministry. The same interpretation may be given to the second parable of the mustard seed. The only difference between the two parables is the first emphasizes that the farmer can do nothing to produce or to hasten the end process, whereas the second emphasizes exclusively the contrast between the small beginnings and the final consummation.
