SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

The Kingdom of God is like a Seed

One of the problems we face in our Christian life and ministry is discouragement; discouragement because of our recurring personal weakness, discouragement because our words of advice and the good example we give to our children do not seem to be bearing fruit, discouragement because our Christian communities are not growing, discouragement because of pervasive selfishness, greed, and conflicts in our world. With all these problems, we often wonder whether there is any hope for our children especially with regard to their faith and whether the church has any future in our country. How about the issue of the sanctity of life?

With the help of the three readings of this Sunday, we are encouraged. The readings are centered on the idea of the seed. In the seed there is power. Once sown in the field, there is little the farmer can do but wait patiently for it to sprout and grow. The issue of sprouting and growing is not the farmer's work. It is God's. It is true that the farmer prepares the field and defends it against animals and thieves. But most of the work is God's. First of all the power in the seed to germinate, grow and produce fruit is made possible by God. Secondly, it is God who supplies the necessary ingredients for this process to work - He sends the rain and the sunshine, which the plants need to grow. The farmer spends several hours in the field and retires at the end of the day but God is at work at each tiny plant at all times.

Jesus in the two seed-parables for instance, addresses the human tendency to believe that human fulfillment comes mostly through our plans and efforts. As a result, when things do not turn out as we have planned and worked to achieve, we become discouraged and lose hope. Jesus reminds us that the coming and growth of God's reign is the work of God's love. So, these two parables tell us three things: First, Jesus tells us to hope. There are occasions when our faith is put to test. It seems that our faith is useless. Let us keep on hoping. Second, Jesus tells us to be patient - patient with ourselves, our children and others. Third, Jesus tells us to trust God. God planted the seed of His Kingdom inside us. He understands what is happening in our heart even if we don't, so we should trust.

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, JUNE 24, 2018**The Nativity of St. John the Baptist****First Reading: Is 49:1-6**

We listen to this reading on the Second Sunday of the Year in Ordinary Time Year A. The text is the second servant song which here is applied to John the Baptist, although the Servant in Isaiah is always associated to the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 139:1-3,13-14,14-15

Psalm 139 expresses God's knowledge, the human being from the moment of conception in the womb. It is a psalm of praise. "I praise you, for I am wonderfully made."

Second Reading: Acts 13:22-26

This passage is a quotation from Paul's teaching on Israel's salvation history. Paul goes rapidly from Egypt to the reign of David, and then on to Christ, whose forerunner was John the Baptist. The story of Jesus here begins not with his birth, but with John the Baptist, the precursor. The text is thus appropriate for the feast.

Gospel: Luke 1:57-66, 80

This gospel passage consists of the birth, circumcision on the eighth day, naming and public presentation of John the Baptist. Just like the birth of Jesus, a mystery surrounds John's annunciation and birth. The passage concludes in words very similar to those used for Jesus. "The child grew and became strong in spirit", and then indicates his going to the desert until his manifestation to Israel. He goes to the desert like Jesus. He goes public after his desert experience like Jesus.

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What Jesus is telling us today is that God's life in us is like a seed planted in the ground. The success of the Kingdom of God both within us and in the world, is more of God's work than ours. God himself planted the seed of faith through the word of God preached to us. No one can stop this seed from growing. Our duty is to hopefully nurture it, trustfully and patiently, by reading the word of God and by praying and receiving the sacraments. Like the farmer we need to cooperate with the grace of God by doing our best to make our Christian lives, our families and our communities what God wants them to be. Do we effectively prepare our hearts? Do we avail ourselves to be taught by God? Do we participate very well in the sacraments? Do we make the faith available to our children and lead them to understand as they grow? Do we truly trust in God and pray to him at all times?

Be generous and you will be prosperous; help others and you will be helped." (Good News Translation) - Prov 11:25

CAMPAIGN PHASE II



Two weeks ago, Erin Gallogly guided us through a parish-wide community needs assessment survey. Thank you for the time you gave to that survey. The results were an affirmation of what we plan to do in the Mililani community in collaboration with service providers. The OCC will certainly be a space for our ongoing parish formation and other events especially on the weekend. However, from Monday through Friday 9 am to 4 pm when there are no parish events, we will use the OCC as a space for outreach in response to the needs we have identified in the survey. Erin will present the results of that survey next Sunday.

Yesterday evening, thanks to our parish leadership, we had a successful OCC groundbreaking ceremony officiated by Msgr. Gary Secor, Vicar General of the Diocese of Honolulu and former pastor of our parish. As you heard in the video, both Bishop Larry Silva and Msgr. Gary Secor are fully behind our efforts for the One Community Center. The appropriate diocesan offices have encouraged us to go forward.

Today we officially launch Phase II of the OCC Capital Campaign with the goal of raising the remaining \$ 900k to reach our parish target of \$ 2.5 million. The purpose is mainly to give a chance to the 700 households who have not yet pledged to do so. Our parish leadership will be on the lanai with new pledge cards. This is your opportunity to be part of this parish project for the future of our next generations.

A pledge means that you fill-in the pledge card committing yourself to give the amount you indicate over the next 3 years. To all who have already made their pledge, we are most grateful. The plan is to wrap up phase 2 of the campaign on July 17 - in exactly one month. I am confident that together we can pull this one off. In the coming days, we need the remaining pledges, but above all let us unite in prayer around this one common purpose.
