SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

Happy Easter!

The time between Easter and Pentecost is a time of instruction. It is used to teach us that the consequence for faith in the Resurrection is, in a word, evangelization. The readings this weekend speak of the disciples and the first Christians professing their faith with joy, often getting into trouble by praising Jesus Christ among people who did not want that name proclaimed. The first reading from the Acts speaks of men willing to suffer imprisonment rather than back down from the love of Jesus Christ. The reading from the Book of Revelation calls us to stay faithful in time of persecution. Time like now in which our Church finds herself threatened around the entire world. Today's powerful vision talks of God's glory being so great that we should stay faithful just to have some small share in it. The Gospel shows us how Jesus had put his trust in Peter, and this trust had remained despite Peter's behavior (denied Jesus three times), but the two had to be reconciled for Peter's sake. Jesus lets Peter know that faithfulness will be difficult and that He recognizes this. There will be times when our faith leads us into places or situations that we would prefer not to be. Jesus asked Peter three times, "Do you love me more than you love them?" Jesus knew Peter's response was heartfelt and truthful, and Peter's love for the Lord brought reconciliation. The story of Peter's reconciliation tells us that if we do love the Lord, there is a consequence. Loving Jesus Christ brings a responsibility. We are celebrating Easter. We are still being reminded of what Jesus Christ did for us in giving His life for us. We are also reminded once again in the effect of the Resurrection on Jesus' followers. They were willing to give up everything to follow the Lord and to tell others about Him. Do we love Jesus like this? Are we willing to sacrifice in order to pursue Him? Or, are we still like the young Peter willing to deny our faith and our values to keep a friend or keep a job? Are there people or things in our life that we still love more than our God? We are called to stay faithful to the name of Jesus. To love Him over everything that surrounds us. This love has the power to save and redeem not only ourselves individually but the whole world as well.

Pastor's Corner

Longest Liturgical Season?

Christ is risen!

Last Sunday we completed the Easter Octave as our Eastern Catholic brothers and sisters were celebrating their Easter! During the Easter Octave, every day is so important that it is treated as a continuation of Easter Sunday itself. The Easter season doesn't end after the Octave of Easter. Because Easter is the most important feast in the Christian calendar, even more important than Christmas, the Easter season continues on for 50 days, through the Ascension of Our Lord to Pentecost Sunday, seven full weeks after Easter Sunday! Indeed, for the purpose of fulfilling our Easter Duty (the requirement to receive Communion at least once during the Easter season), the Easter season extends a bit further, until Trinity Sunday, the first Sunday after Pentecost. The final week is not counted as part of the Easter season

What is the Math?

If Pentecost Sunday is the seventh Sunday after Easter Sunday, should that not mean that the Easter season is only 49 days long? After all, seven weeks times seven days is 49 days, right? There's no problem with your math. But just as we count both Easter Sunday and Divine Mercy Sunday in the Octave of Easter, so, too, we count both Easter Sunday and Pentecost Sunday in the 50 days of the Easter season. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us in his famous Easter homily, read in Eastern Catholic churches on Easter, Christ has destroyed death, and now is the "feast of faith." Let us continue to rejoice and be glad for the mystery of the risen Lord in our midst. We rejoice because in the words of St. Augustine "we are an Easter people, and Alleluia is our song!"

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, MAY 12, 2019

Fourth Sunday of Easter

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 13:14,43-52

This passage comes immediately after the healing of the cripple that led to the arrest of Peter and John by the religious leaders. Since the religious leaders wanted to know by what authority the Apostles had performed the miracle, Peter responds that the healing of this man is proof that Jesus is risen from the dead, and that he is the source of salvation for all.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 100:1-2,3,5

Psalm 118 refers to the Israelite nation, oppressed by other nations and yet favored by God. Early Christians, as in the first reading, saw these words as typifying the Jewish reaction to Jesus as the fulfillment of God's saving work. Response: "The stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone."

Second Reading: Revelation: 7:9,14-17

These verses intend to make a link with the first reading. The world (human society) "did not know him" (God). Therefore the unbelieving world rejected and crucified God's revelation in Christ. We have accepted that revelation and so through our baptism we are children of God. We are called to recognize the full dignity of what we are now, and live accordingly, for that is the seed of what we will become.

Gospel: John 10:27-30

In this Gospel, Jesus follows a long Hebrew Scripture tradition that frequently depicted God as a shepherd, beginning with Gn 49:24. Psalm 23 is the most familiar. The great king David had been a shepherd, and is referred to as shepherd of the people in Ps 78:70-72. Later leaders were often corrupt and called unfaithful shepherds by the prophets who gave voice to God's promise that he would shepherd his people. Jesus is therefore the fulfillment of that promise when he tells the parable of the good shepherd. He intends to show that different from other shepherds, he is the good shepherd who literally lays down his life for the sheep. This image has two applications. The first application connects laying down one's life with the defense of the sheep against "wolves", a traditional image of false teachers. The second application speaks first of the inner life of the Church (the shepherd knows the sheep by name) and then of the Church's missionary outreach: the other sheep who are not yet members of this fold: the Gentiles. The mission of the Church is both to defend the sheep from wrong ideas about salvation which comes through Christ alone; the second aspect of the Church's mission is the unity of the Church, so that there will be one flock and one shepherd.
