SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

Sixth Sunday of Easter, Year C

Central to the Gospel passage today are the words of Jesus concerning the peace that he gives to his disciples as his farewell gift to them. But Jesus tells them that the peace he gives them is different from what the world offers. One of the popular misconceptions about peace is that peace involves the total absence of conflict or difficulties. However, because of the imperfection of man, conflicts and misunderstanding must arise; because we live in a society where each individual is unique, it is normal to experience differences of behavior and conflicting opinions. What matters most is not the conflicts that come up as we interact with each other but how we react to them.

Jesus' peace is not just on the surface; it is something deep down which can be there even in times of hardship, conflict and suffering. Jesus is talking about an inner peace, the peace of having God with us in our walks through life; the effects of the abiding presence of God in our lives. The peace that he bequeaths is the spiritual serenity and certainty that comes from harmony and profound communion with God and His son Jesus. That is why Jesus tells us in the Gospel today: "Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them" (John 14:23).

Abiding with the Word of God, with its consequent communion in the love of the Father and the Son, is made possible when the Holy Spirit comes into our hearts. That is why Jesus links the peace he gives with the promised coming of the Holy Spirit. Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the early Church sought to live in love and share the gift of peace. We have a vivid example of this in the First Reading of today from the Acts of the Apostles. The first reading tells us how the Holy Spirit, dwelling in the Church, helped the apostles to solve a major doctrinal problem, which shook the very foundation of the early Church.

In our world today, many families are torn apart and relationships are broken because of the inability of the parties to go into dialogue. Communities go to war because they cannot tolerate each other. We can demonstrate our tolerance at home, by focusing on the strengths of members of the family rather than their weaknesses. We can show our tolerance at the work place by showing kindness and acceptance to all – not just those who are comfortable with us and our ideas.

Peace is the product of dialogue and tolerance, driven by love and obedience, inspired by the inspiration and guidance of the Holy Spirit. However, to be able to receive these gifts, it is necessary for us to spend a little time each day in personal prayer, talking to God and listening to Him.

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, JUNE 2, 2019

The Ascension of the Lord

First Reading: Acts 1:1-11

The opening verses refer to an earlier work by Luke probably his Gospel. The mention of Theophilus, probably the patron of the author, makes this point clear. The author identifies the scope of the contents of the first book (the Gospel) and then recounts the event of the ascension of Jesus, which is found at the end of the Gospel of Luke. The ascension thus become the transition from the earthly ministry of Jesus to the experience of the early Church. The apostles were witnesses of both the resurrection and the ascension when Jesus commissions them to be his witnesses to the ends of the earth.

Responsorial Psalm: 47:2-3,6-7,8-9

The tone of psalm 47 fits in with the solemnity we celebrate. It begins with a call to praise God with both a ringing cry and a clapping of hands. The cry is a shout of jubilation connected with divine sacrifice. The clapping of hands was used as a substitute for the blowing of trumpets. This psalm of enthronement uses two very significant divine titles: LORD and Most High.

Second Reading: Ephesians 1:17-23

This reading, though addresses to the Ephesian community, is a series of intercessions. The prayer is for a threefold spiritual enlightenment for the believers to know: 1) the hope of the calling they have received from God; 2) the riches of the glory of God's inheritance in the holy ones; and 3) the surpassing greatness of God's power to those who believe. The power referred to throughout the reading belongs to God alone. It was God's power that raised Jesus from the dead and seated him in the place of honour in heaven; it was God's power that made all things subject to Christ and exalted him as head of his Body, the Church.

Gospel Reading: Luke 24:46-53

In the Gospel passage, Jesus delivers one last instruction to his disciples before he ascends into heaven. He reminds them that his death and resurrection as well as the basic content of his preaching had been foretold. In the light of the resurrection, there is no question in the minds of the disciples regarding the truth of these events since they were eye witnesses to them. Now Jesus before going up to heaven tells them they must also be witnesses (martyrs) to them. They are to proclaim to all the nations, that he did die and rise, and that he did preach repentance and the forgiveness of sins. They will do this as a fulfilment of God's plan of salvation. The image of returning to Jerusalem is important as it means facing East; facing the risen Lord; facing the Light of Easter.

sisters access to spiritual resources that they have lived too long without.

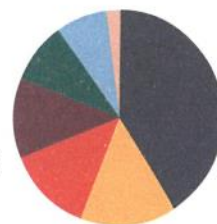

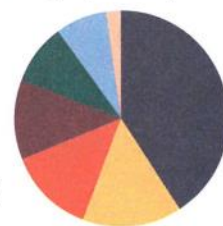
