SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

Pentecost Sunday

"I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life." This Sunday, we affirm and celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles. This is what we call Pentecost. The word Pentecost comes from the Greek (πεντηκοστή), which means the fiftieth day. Fifty days after the resurrection, Christ fulfills his promise by sending the gift of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples. Pentecost is one of the most colorful celebrations in the liturgical year. In the first reading, we relive the event of the first Pentecost. We are told that a noise like a strong driving wind came from the sky. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire resting on each of them. The Holy Spirit works in our lives like fire: illuminating our minds to understand the truth; warming our cold hearts and revitalizing our energy. In the second reading, Paul deals with the issue of some members of the Corinthian community who considered themselves more important than others on account of their personal talents. Paul reminds them that God's Spirit is the source of unity as well as of a wonderful diversity of gifts for the growth of the community. The Gospel from John gives a brief account of the Risen Lord Jesus offering the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Apostles and sending them. "As the Father has sent me, so I send you... Receive the Holy Spirit," the Spirit of forgiveness, peace and reconciliation.

Pentecost is therefore the crowning of the Paschal Mystery of Christ, who now fulfills his promise of sending the Holy Spirit upon the apostles. Let us for a moment recall the words of the promise. "When the advocate comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who issues from the Father, he will be my witness. And you too will be witnesses, because you have been with me from the outset" (Jn. 15:26). There are those who give witness today by living in the way that Jesus taught as the only way to live. The first reading, we hear that everyone in Jerusalem heard the apostles and disciples speaking in their own language. Biblical scholars interpret the apostles' gift of speaking in languages understood by all present in terms of a prophetic sign of the worldwide mission and proclamation of God's kingdom in all known languages of the world today. That is how powerful the Holy Spirit can be if we allow him into our lives. The power of the Holy Spirit is the greatest untapped power in the world. In the readings of today we see some of the things the Holy Spirit makes possible: communication in a language deeper than words; inner peace; transformation; forgiveness of sins; reconciliation and unity between estranged people; and every worthwhile gift. When we are open to the power of the Holy Spirit, we can accomplish incredible things we never imagined.

Pastor's Corner

The Incredible Power of the Holy Spirit

Imagine a Bible without chapters and verses. That was the situation in the 13th century when Fr. Stephen Langton was ordained a priest and then appointed Archbishop of Canterbury. King John of England however feared him and exiled him to Paris. While in exile, Stephen Langton was inspired to do a number of things that might surprise you.

The Old Testament was already separated into paragraphs and sections, but did not have a specific numbering system. Also, traditionally both the New and Old Testaments were transmitted orally. In particular, chanting sacred scripture was an ancient way of passing on the words of Divine Revelation to the next generation. Christians learned this method from the Jewish people, who have been chanting the words of scripture for thousands of years.

For this reason, in ancient and early medieval homilies, there is no citation of biblical verses. Quotations from scripture came from memory or were copied from scrolls or books used by clergy and religious. The laity did not have access to any physical copies and passed on the Bible to their children from what they heard at Mass as well as through the artwork seen in paintings and church architecture.

Then everything changed with Stephen Langton, Archbishop of Canterbury in the 13th century. When the King of England exiled him to Paris, he was inspired and came up with a system of dividing up the Latin Vulgate into chapters. His system was soon accepted in 1227 AD, and since soon all other modern Bibles have based their own numbering system.

But, Stephen Langton was inspired to do more. He is the one who composed the hymn "Veni Sancto Spiritus" – "Come Holy Spirit", which called the Sequence that we sing on Pentecost Sunday before the Gospel.

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, JUNE 16, 2019

The Most Holy Trinity

First Reading: Proverbs 8:22-31

The Wisdom of God that speaks in this passage though feminine is clearly not human but divine creative wisdom because a deity would have been present at creation. As the passage develops, wisdom is said to have been poured out and brought forth as if by birth (cf. vv. 24,25.) She calls herself the first of God's ways, the one before all of God's other deeds. She certainly comes from God and so must be a personification of God's creative qualities. She is the craftsperson or architect of all that is created.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 8:4-5, 6-7, 8-9

The responsorial psalm is a hymn that praises God for the wonders of the universe. The psalmist gazes at the night sky, spellbound by its magnificence, marvelling at the wonders of the universe and then at the extraordinary role the human being plays within it despite human finite and frail nature.

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-3

The central theme of this passage is justification by faith. Every blessing mentioned in the passage emerges from the believers having been justified by faith in Jesus Christ through his death and resurrection. According to Paul, this is already an accomplished fact. We are already reconciled with the Father in Christ who is the love of God poured out into our hearts by the Holy Spirit. This is Paul's way of speaking of how our Christian life is linked to the life of the Holy Trinity.

Gospel Reading: John 16:12-15

These four verses of the Gospel only give a glimpse of John's thinking on the Holy Trinity. This teaching is not developed here. Jesus states that he has much more to teach the disciples, but cannot understand it now. When the Spirit of truth comes he will teach them everything. In other words, the Holy Spirit will unfold in their minds and hearts what they were not able to understand and give them the ability to communicate it to others. The mission of the Spirit is therefore one of guidance into the deeper meaning and radical implications of the teaching of Jesus. What he teaches comes from the Father. The Holy Spirit is the vehicle by which that teaching is not only communicated to the followers of Jesus, but also comes alive as they witness.
