SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

The context of this Sunday's gospel (Mark 10:35-45) is that Jesus sets on the journey to Jerusalem. In Mark, the journey to Jerusalem starts in Chapter Ten Verse One (Mark 10:1ff). In this chapter, Jesus is walking resolutely ahead of his disciples on the road, knowing full well the fate that awaits him in Jerusalem. On his journey to Jerusalem, Jesus deals with issues of commitment in life. The first issue is on marriage. The Pharisees asked Jesus, "is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife?" (Mark 10: 2). Jesus answered with a big "NO!" However, Moses gave a certificate of divorce to the women in order to be free and to get married again, because they had no freedom. As he continues on his journey, some people brought children to Jesus to be blessed, and then a rich young man knelt to Jesus and asked him "what must I do to inherit internal life?" (Mark 10:17). This man failed to make a decision in his life to follow Jesus and "went away sad" because he cringed to his possession.

In our gospel for this Sunday (Mark 10:35-45), we are told that as Jesus continued his journey to Jerusalem, James and John presented their dreams of power and glory. Mark tells us that, James and John approached Jesus and asked: "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left." (Mark 10:37) Jesus told them they did not know what they were asking. They were thinking in terms of this world; they wanted what this world considers great. In other words, they were saying to him: "Give us the two top places of honor in your kingdom." However, what Jesus considers great is something entirely different: "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all."

(Mark 10:43-44)

My dear brothers and sisters, the thinking of James and John had been contaminated. Just like James and John, our thinking too can be influenced by the false thinking of the world. We could in negative ways hold up as great only what is great in the eyes of the world. For example, social media and television have their own different measuring sticks for what is considered to be great. However, Jesus says the one who is truly great in the eyes of God is the one who is a servant, and the one who is first is a slave to all.

Finally, we can say that the message of today's gospel is as relevant to our time as it was in the time of Jesus. As members of Christ's body, the Church, we are all called to be witnesses to God's reign of justice, peace, and love. We are challenged to resist the insidious attractions of fame and prestige and to be humble servants. We are called to imitate the kind of servant leadership embodied by Jesus, who gave "his life to redeem many people." (Mark 10:45). This entails that, such service is liberating and joyful, for it makes us true disciples of Jesus Christ. Thus, we become great in God's eyes and the people we serve in our communities.

Number 3: Gifts

God has showered us with a multitude of gifts. He has given us our very existence. He has given us our identity, that is who we are and what we can do. He has given us this world to live in and to manage. He has given us the gift of time on earth.

A steward recognizes that everything that he has, and everything that he is, and every second of his life is a gift from God.

The pastoral letter on stewardship by the United States Council of Catholic Bishops gives us an explanation of what a steward does with God's gifts. "A steward is one who receives God's gifts gratefully, cherishes and tends them in a responsible and accountable manner, shares them in justice and love with others, and returns them with increase to the Lord."

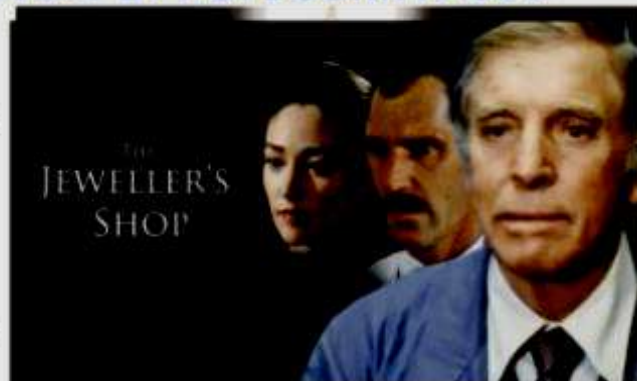

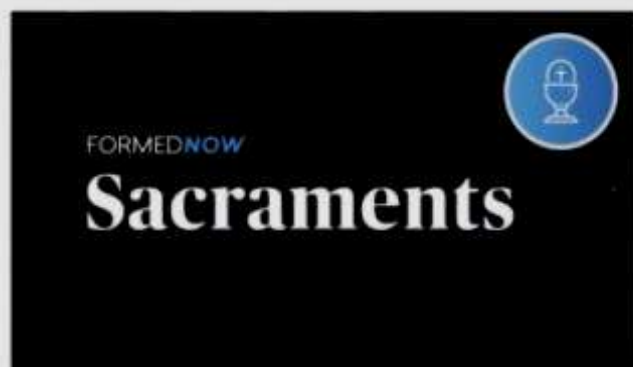
THE JEWELER'S SHOP: A MODERN MYSTERY BY POPE JOHN PAUL II
